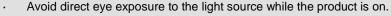

- Always disconnect the product from the power source before cleaning or replacing the fuse.





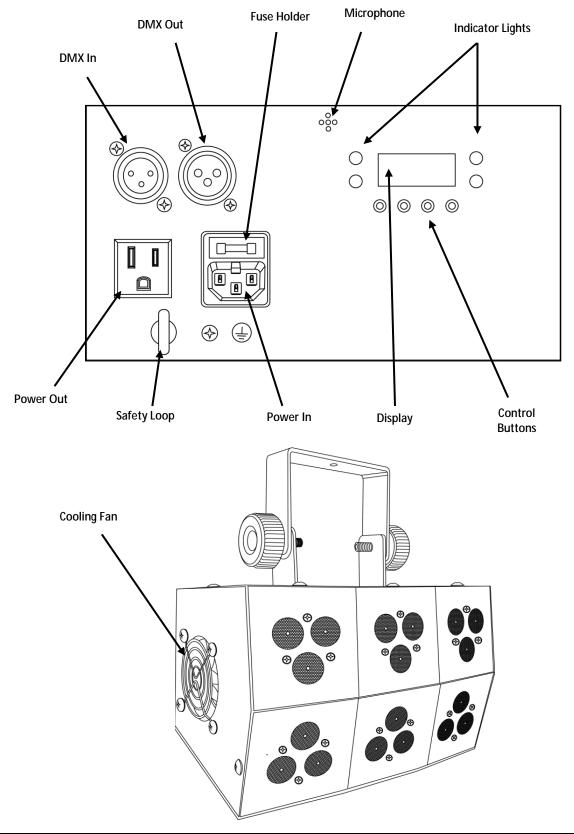
- Make sure the power cord is not crimped or damaged.

- The product is not intended for permanent installation.
- Always make sure that the voltage of the outlet to which you are connecting the product is within the range stated on the decal or rear panel of the product.
- The product is for indoor use only! (IP20) To prevent risk of fire or shock, do not expose the product to rain or moisture.
- Always install the product in a location with adequate ventilation, at least 20 in (50 cm) from adjacent surfaces.
- Be sure that no ventilation slots on the product's housing are blocked.
- Never connect the product to a dimmer.
- Make sure to replace the fuse with another of the same type and rating.
- Never carry the product from the power cord or any moving part. Always use the hanging/mounting bracket.
- The maximum ambient temperature (Ta) is 104 °F (40 °C). Do not operate the product at higher temperatures.

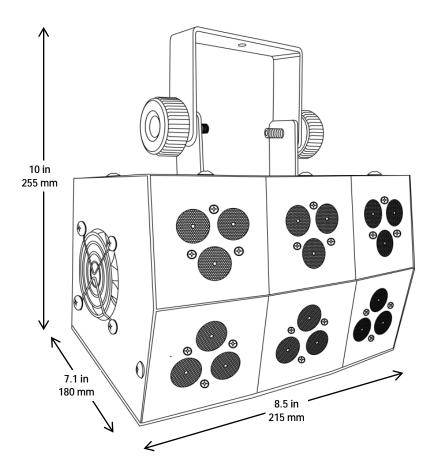

## 3. Setup

AC Power The Wash FX<sup>™</sup> has an auto-ranging power supply and it can work with an input voltage range of 100 to 240 VAC, 50/60 Hz. To determine the product's power requirements (circuit breaker, power outlet, and wiring), use the current value listed on the label affixed to the product's back panel, or refer to the product's specifications chart. The listed current

Always connect the product to a protected circuit (circuit breaker or fuse). Make sure the product has an appropriate electrical ground to avoid the risk of electrocution or fire.

rating indicates the product's average current draw under normal conditions.

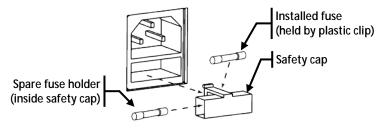


Never connect the product to a rheostat (variable resistor) or dimmer circuit, even if the rheostat or dimmer channel serves only as a 0 to 100% switch.

Replacement

- 1. Wedge the tip of a flat-head screwdriver into the slot of the fuse holder.
- 2. Pry the fuse holder out of the housing.
- 3. Remove the blown fuse from the holder and replace with a fuse of the exact same type and rating.
- 4. Insert the fuse holder back in place and reconnect power.

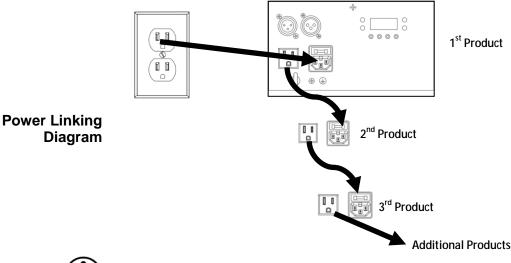




Disconnect the product from the power outlet before replacing the fuse.

Power Linking

The product provides power linking via the Edison outlet located in the back of the unit. Please see the diagram below for further explanation.





You can power link up to 11 Wash  $FX^{TM}$  units on 120 VAC or up to 22 Wash  $FX^{TM}$  units on 230 VAC.

The power linking diagram corresponds to the North American version of the product ONLY! If using the product in other markets, you must consult with the local Chauvet distributor as power linking connectors and requirements may differ in your country or region.

### **Mounting** Before mounting the product, read and follow the safety recommendations indicated in the <u>Safety Notes</u>.

- **Orientation** The Wash FX<sup>™</sup> may be mounted in any position; however, make sure adequate ventilation is provided around the product.
  - **Rigging** · Before deciding on a location for the product, always make sure there is easy access to the product for maintenance and programming purposes.
    - Make sure that the structure onto which you are mounting the product can support the product's weight. See the <u>Technical Specifications</u> for weight information.
    - When mounting the product overhead, always use a safety cable. Mount the product securely to a rigging point, whether an elevated platform or a truss.
    - When rigging the product onto a truss, use a mounting clamp of appropriate weight capacity.
    - When power linking multiple products, mount the products close enough for power linking cables to reach.
    - The bracket adjustment knobs allow for directional adjustment when aiming the product to the desired angle. Only loosen or tighten the bracket knobs manually. Using tools could damage the knobs.

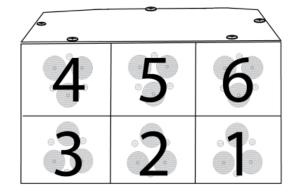

# Configuration (Standalone)

**Configuration** Set the product in one of the standalone modes to control without a DMX controller.



Connect the product to a suitable power outlet.

Never connect a product that is operating in any standalone mode to a DMX string connected to a DMX controller. Products in standalone mode may transmit DMX signals that could interfere with the DMX signals from the controller.

Automatic Mode To (including Sound- 1. Active Mode) 2.

Automatic Mode To run the Wash<sup>™</sup> FX in automatic mode, follow the instructions below:

- 1. Press **<MENU>** to reach the menu's main level and **Addr** shows on the display.
- 2. Use  $\langle UP \rangle$  or  $\langle DOWN \rangle$  until AUto shows on the display.
- 3. Press **<ENTER>** and **rUn** will show on the display.
- 4. Press **<ENTER>**.

NOTE: While in Automatic mode, the Wash<sup>™</sup> FX will respond to sound.



The product will only respond to low frequencies of music (bass and drums).

Custom Color	To custom mix a color and select the strobe speed, follow the instructions below:
Mixing and Strobe	1. Press <b><menu></menu></b> to reach the menu's main level and <b>Addr</b> shows on the display.

- 3. Press **<ENTER>**.

Master/Slave The Master/Slave mode allows a single Wash<sup>™</sup> FX (the master) to control the actions of Mode one or more Wash™ FX products (the slaves) without the need of a DMX controller. The master will be set to operate in either Custom or Sound-Active mode, or an auto program, while the slave units will be set to operate in Slave mode. Once set and connected, the slaves will operate in unison with the master unit.

Configure the units as indicated below.

#### Slave units:

- 1. Press <MENU> repeatedly until SLnd shows on the display.
- 2. Press <ENTER> and SL-0 or SL-1 will show on the display.
  - Note: SL-0 and SL-1 currently have the same functionality. Any differentiation between the two options is reserved for future use.
- 3. Use <UP> or <DOWN> to select the slave mode.
- Connect the DMX input of the first slave unit to the DMX output of the master. 4.
- Connect the DMX input of the subsequent slaves to the DMX output of the previous 5. slave.
- Finish setting and connecting all the slaves.

#### Master unit:

- 1. Set the master to operate in Custom, Preset, or Auto mode.
- 2. Make the master unit the first unit in the daisy chain.
- Configure all the slave units before connecting the master to the daisy chain.

Never connect a DMX controller to a DMX string configured for Master/Slave operation because the controller may interfere with the signals from the master.

Do not connect more than 31 slaves to the master.

### **5. MAINTENANCE**

# Maintenance

**Product** Dust build-up reduces light output performance and can cause overheating. This can lead to reduction of the light source's life and/or mechanical wear. To maintain optimum performance and minimize wear, clean your lighting products at least twice a month. However, be aware that usage and environmental conditions could be contributing factors to increase the cleaning frequency.

To clean the product, follow the instructions below:

- 1. Unplug the product from power.
- 2. Wait until the product is at room temperature.
- Use a vacuum (or dry compressed air) and a soft brush to remove dust collected on 3. the external surface/vents.
- Clean all transparent surfaces with a mild soap solution, ammonia-free glass 4. cleaner, or isopropyl alcohol.
- 5. Apply the solution directly to a soft, lint free cotton cloth or a lens cleaning tissue.
- Softly drag any dirt or grime to the outside of the transparent surface. 6.
- 7. Gently polish the transparent surfaces until they are free of haze and lint.

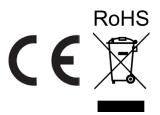


Always dry the transparent surfaces carefully after cleaning them.

Do not spin the cooling fans using compressed air because you could damage them.
